VICTORY! STATEWIDE **POLICY SUPPORTS** BICYCLING

Environmental Impact Reports to include transportation guidelines that encourage bicycle facilities

Reform of the California Environmental Quality Act's "Transportation Guidelines" is on the way! This momentous policy change was an EBBC campaign with other organizations like the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition and the Planning and Conservation League. The resulting reforms promise to literally pave the way for bicyclists-especially in congested built-up areas near transit.

Current environmental policies for transportation protect driving while creating legal barriers to build new bikeways, widen sidewalks or create dedicated bus lanes. Ironically, CEQA keeps cities from installing new bike lanes near Smart Growth and transit.

It sounds crazy, but it's true. CEQA requires projects that have an effect on traffic to evaluate future roadway capacity in the year 2035. This absurd policy has thwarted many bikeway installations!

On April 18, 2009, EBBC's Dave Campbell and Robert Raburn traveled to the State

To overcome CEQA protections for roadway capacity on Lakeshore Ave, EBBC first lobbied voter support for Measure DD in 2002 (\$196m bond). then we fought to get city council approval of a "statement of overriding consideration" to add bike lanes. Future improvements should be easier!

Capitol to testify in support of the proposed amendments that strikeout the "capacity" barrier.

"The changes will allow local cities to design their roadways so that they work for everyone,

including bicyclists. No longer will the safety of bicyclists be ignored when cities consider new developments and related roadway

The new map depicts bicycle facilities and connections (as well as warnings) that extend from Crockett in the north to Fremont in the south. It reflects important changes like the addition of bike lanes on Oakland's Lakeshore Ave, directions between the Carquinez Strait Bridge path in Vallejo and the new Benicia-Martinez Bridge path, and progress on the Bay Trail bikeway. Of course we include updates on bicycle-friendly transit and even the locations of our growing list of Supporting Shops that offer discounts to EBBC members.

Albany Strollers & Rollers encourage youth to ride

One year ago, Albany Strollers & Rollers received a \$300 donation from Grizzly Peak Cyclists. As an organization comprised of volunteers and without membership fees or dues, AS&R hadn't had this much money to spend before and thought long and hard about how to use it to make a difference in the community.

We used GPC's donation, along with money from the City of Albany and Safe Routes to School to purchase rear blinking bike lights. A company called Fun Source, LLC runs "Project Community Safe," in which for every rear bike light an organization sells, they give the group an equal number to distribute free to children in the community. They're terrific products, and by AS&R sell-

ing them for \$8 each (two for \$15), they were an impulse item that many people seemed to need! By the end of September we had sold over 150 rear safety lights - just in time for school.

Wednesday, October 7th was International Bike & Walk to School Day, so AS&R members and **Councilmember Farid Javandel** were stationed at Albany's three elementary schools and the Middle School. Working feverishly as the kids arrived, we installed lights on the bikes (and some scooters) of 150 Albany students. Kids, parents, teachers, school administrators and city officials were all thrilled with the program and the free lights.

As you may have guessed, with the success of the light distribution at IBWSD, we are now back at the beginning of the cycle, so need to sell more in order to sustain the program and give more students lights in the future. As the days get shorter and the holidays approach, please consider purchasing some lights, so we can accrue more free lights to distribute to students in our next giveaway. Bike Hoppin' on Linden Street

Adam Lamoreaux founded the Linden Street Brewery in Oakland and started brewing beer last June. Not only is he committed to re-establishing Oakland's rich brewing tradition, but he wants to contribute to another old tradition--cargo bikes. His newest toy is a Dutch-style

Long John cargo bike, on which kegs of beer will be delivered to local restaurants and bars.

"Hopefully, this bike is the first of many cargo bikes for my business, which is all about sustainability," Adam explained. "California farmers should be growing hops again, I want to use reusable containers in our packaging, and cargo bikes

for distribution, all part of our zero waste solution."

Adam worked with local bike manufacturer **Michael Cleaver** of *Cleaver Bikes* in West Oakland to build the Dutchstyle work bike. Adam intends to show that his cargo bike is an integral part of the brewery. "We want to show people that if a local brewery can be delivering kegs, what could other people be doing? I hope when people see our

cargo bike bopping around town it is not only going to make them chuckle a little to see a bike that can carry two kegs, but also open up a new way of thinking."

The most critical proposed change in the *Transportation Guidelines* is the removal of the word "capacity." The concept of capacity has acted to guard and promote automobile traffic to the detriment of any other mode of travel. In place of this unhealthy fixation we can look forward to an inclusive consideration of "the performance of the circulation system, taking into account all modes...."
