WHEN & HOW TO REPORT HAZARDS

Yes

Is this issue an emergency requiring immediate assistance?

(such as a collision, downed power line, or flooding)



Yes

Don't submit this as a hazard report.

Call your local emergency response number instead



Can this request be resolved with routine maintenance by Public Works?

(like pothole fills, street sweeping, broken walk buttons - not new or upgraded infrastructure requests)



Contact your city staff or elected officials for assistance.

HAZARD REPORTING GUIDELINES



WHAT TO INCLUDE IN YOUR REPORT

1) Accurate location or street address

Use your smartphone to record the GPS location, or include the nearest street address. In areas without a street address, include recognizable landmarks in your description and photos

2) Detailed description

Include info to help the Public Works crew locate and address the issue. For example: "Pothole is in the rightmost north-bound lane on Main Street, just north of the intersection with Park Street".

3) Be specific

Make a single report for each issue. When reporting potholes, submit each one separately with a photo and location. Entire streets or blocks in need of repaving can not be addressed by a Public Works crew and should instead be reported to city staff or local elected officials.

4) Say "bicycle"

If reporting an issue on SeeClickFix, include a word like "bike" or "bicycle". This will flag the issue for Bike East Bay and we will be notified automatically.

5) Add a good photo

Include a photo of the issue showing the context of the street, **not a close up**. This will help the repair crew locate and fix it. You can circle the hole with spray paint to help others avoid it until it can be addressed.
